- 1.1 The college recognises that all students have the right to appeal against decisions made about the standard of their vocational and/or academic work, or the marks or grades allocated.
- 1.2 Where qualifications are assessed and marked externally by the awarding body (for example examinations) each awarding body has an appeals procedure, a copy of which is held by the examinations officer. The college will support any student who wishes to appeal to an awarding body. However, if there is a financial cost involved, the college will require the student to pay any fees incurred.
- 1.3 If a student cannot afford the awarding body fees, they can apply to the college's hardship fund via Student Services.
- 1.4 All students will be informed of the appeals procedure during their induction programme and this information will also be included in the student handbook.
- 1.5 Where there is an appeal against internal assessment decisions, a student will be offered the support of an advocate. This could be their student mentor, course leader, someone from student services, or a fellow student.
- 1.6 Procedures for both Internal and External Assessment appeals are detailed in the **Appeals Against Assessment Decisions** procedure
